Full report developed.</li> <li>We are beginning the process of pursuing a New Market Tax Credit application.</li> <li>Co-City Project: the Co-City Project Luncheon will be held Wednesday, May 29<sup>th</sup>, Ro Clayton Gillette, Sheila Foster, and Manny Patole will visit then. Co-City is an initiati Marron Institute for Urban Management at NYU and the LabGov Project at Georgete on supporting and cultivating collaborative, community led community development cities both domestically and abroad.
