Mr. Andermann reported that a total of 34 tax certificates were purchased in 2013 for a total of \$424,000. 21 tax certificates were purchased at the June tax sale and 13 tax certificates at the September tax sale. In the first 6 months, 60% (20) of the properties have been redeemed for the tax sale purchase price of \$216,000 plus the interest and penalties of \$21,000.

Mr. Andermann then presented the Board with the resolution authorizing representatives to purchase properties at any and all 2014 East Baton Rouge Parish tax sales for an aggregate purchase price of no more than \$500,000. Mrs. Wells, Jones Walker, added that the resolution also authorized the transfer of the properties to the appropriate LLCs.

CONCLUSIONS

Mrs. Turner made a motion to approve the resolution authorizing representatives to purchase properties at any and all 2014 East Baton Rouge Parish tax sales for an aggregate purchase price of no more than \$500,000. Mr. Braxton seconded the motion.

In a voice vote, Mr. Braxton, Mrs. Turner and Mr. Noland voted aye. The resolution was unanimously approved.

DISCUSSION

Mr. Boyles reported the following status updates:

- Stantec, engineering firm and CSRS, surveying firm are collectively completing preliminary engineering designs for the 30 acre Phase I. Initial infrastructure will be designed to support the Automotive Training Center (ATC) as a standalone site. RDA now has the first draft.
- Design Guidelines with RDA comments have been reviewed by staff and Architects Southwest and returned for editing. The Guidelines include regulations for homes, buildings, roadway, landscape and all aesthetic appearances.
- Bani, Carville & Brown Architects have completed their preliminary schematic designs and cost estimates for the ATC building and site and have submitted to State Facilities for review.
- Environmental Review request was submitted to the City Parish Office of Community Development on November 15th. By request of LDEQ, our engineering firm is completing an air quality assessment. We are awaiting further agency comments for additional requirements. Because no floodplains or wetlands are affected in Phase I, we expect comments to be minimal.
- An Application Amendment was submitted to City Parish Office of Community Development on November 15th. The amendment is to provide the state Disaster Recovery Unit an updated use of the site for the community college expansion.
- Stantec's engineers are placing the Phase I tree survey on auto-cad so that trees may be identified by landscape architects within the Phase I development scope with recommendations on incorporation into the landscape design.
- The RDA will be working with the Department of Public Works to continue their ditch bank clearing of drainage canals and ditch servitudes as they initiated between Ardenwood and Lobdell Drives. The completed servitude work is already showing an impact on improving the wetland conditions.
- The RDA's efforts with the Mayor's Office and the East Baton Rouge Public Housing Authority have been rewarded by a HUD Choice Neighborhoods Planning Grant to the Mayor's Office. HUD awarded \$500,000 for a Neighborhood Plan centered on needed improvements of the Housing Authority's Ardenwood Apartments and will use the RDA's Melrose East Community Improvement Plan and Ardendale Master Plan and Design Guidelines as the planning baseline. The awarded neighborhood is bounded by Lobdell to the east, Florida to the south, Greenwell Springs to the north, and Foster to the west, taking in almost all areas surrounding Ardendale.
